#### **POLICY**

- Notifications on Compass
- An annual magazine.

### The parents send in:

- Enrolment forms
- Notes concerning absences, uniform, problems, queries
- Excursion permission forms and money.

### Parents and teachers get together for:

- Parent/teacher interviews
- Information evenings about camps, course selections, etc.
- Concerts, fetes and expositions, award ceremonies
- Sports days
- Forums

It is the **students' responsibility** to ensure that all letters are delivered to the parents and that reply slips are returned to the college.

### **Parent Involvement**

The College Council and staff encourage parent involvement in the school. We do not just mean parents attending functions to raise money for the school, but parent involvement in all aspects of the College:-
