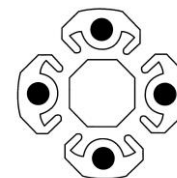


PORTLAND SECONDARY COLLEGE



Dear Parent/ Caregiver,

Student Support Services offer a range of services to ensure students are provided with a high level of professional support. Integration, Student Services, Doctors In Secondary Schools and Catchup, are intensive services provided by PSC.

Students and staff benefit greatly from the care, expertise and flexibility of our Student Services Team. Assistance includes, classroom support across all curriculum areas, health, nutrition and hygiene needs, paramedical arrangements, counselling and connecting with the community, follow-up assistance, excursions, sport, and timetables,

Our Integration Program operates under guidelines of the Department of Education and Training's Program for Students with Disabilities.

We take considerable time and care with transition arrangements for students. Transition visits are frequently arranged in Semester 2. Integration staff visit primary schools and attend meetings with students, parents/ carers, Grade 6 teacher and support staff, to ensure that all requirements are in place before Secondary School commences.

DISS	Doctors in Secondary Schools provides a clinic at PSC for students to access medical advice. Onsite clinic one day a week
Reengagement	Staff from Integration support the offsite Reengagement Program
