# Principal Report

Another fortnight has flown past and Term 1 is well underway. The first two weeks of School have been actioned packed with Student Leader interviews, parent/student/mentor interviews, a welcome BBQ for Year 7 students, a whole school assembly, swimming sports, Casual Clothes Day fundraising day to support Breast cancer, Year 7 Camp Out, Hands On Learning Program, PATS testing, Parent Information session on the 2024 Indonesian Tour, School Photos being held and all classes underway. News of some of these events are included elsewhere in the newsletter. Parents can stay informed of what is happening by logging onto Compass regularly – there is a lot of things going on each week for all students.

A whole school Assembly was held last week to welcome staff and students back to Portland Secondary College and a special welcome was issued to all Year 7 students and those students new to the College at other year levels. Students were reminded of their rights and responsibilities and all students were encouraged to take up any and all opportunities open to them. This message was reiterated by College Captains Sam Shelton and Nyla Conheady who also urged students to embrace leadership opportunities. New staff were introduced, and a range of leadership opportunities were outlined. All students were encouraged to take on board the mantra of High Expectations – no excuses!

Portland Secondary College offers students a vast range of opportunities to step up and showcase their leadership skills. Taking on a leadership position helps students develop confidence and allows them to hone their organisational, public speaking, analytical and listening skills and looks great on a resume when going for a part time job. Currently in the College we are encouraging students to take on the roles of Year Level Leadership positions. The criteria for these leadership positions in the College is varied and asks students to provide positive leadership for the students in the form, to be a positive role model for fellow students, to provide leadership and assistance in selecting and organising both swimming and athletics teams. Students are, of course, also expected to abide by College rules and the College uniform regulations and to get involved in the vast range of opportunities offered. Other leadership opportunities able to be taken up include Music Captains, Inclusion Leader, Diversity Leader, Public Speaking Captains and to be part of the Student Voice and Agency Committee. Currently I am seeking applications from a junior student to take on the role of Flag Monitor. Any student interested in applying for this role should see Ms Kindred as soon as possible. All our School Leaders will be inducted into the College during a ceremony for students and parents on March 15th. Keep this date free!

Our Casual Day held last Friday raised over \$800 for breast cancer research and was organised by our Senior School leadership team, the School Captains and Year 12 Level manager, Ms Joe Logan. Students came to school dressed in pink and enjoyed a sausage sizzle and pink finger buns at lunchtime.

On Monday of this week the entire school headed to the Pool for the Swimming Sports and enjoyed a beautiful day in the sunshine whilst competing in a wide range of swimming and novelty events. Congratulations to the students who won their age group championship medals and to all students who hopped in the pool and had a go at winning points for their year level. Overall winners for each Sub-School will be released shortly. However, I would like to ask parents to refrain from coming to collect their student before the day is finished. Please encourage some resilience in your child as all students are expected to participate for the entire day. Our mantra of High Expectations – no excuses – applies to all members of our School community.



# Principal Report

Parents may be aware of an incident of unsafe student behaviour involving a small group of students that occurred at our school last week. Such incidents are very rare at Portland Secondary College. When they do occur, we work closely with students and families/carers to ensure they understand the behaviour standards expected at our school and use appropriate means to resolve conflicts. I want to assure you that the health and safety of our students and staff is our top priority, and we are taking this matter very seriously. Any form of violence/bullying within our school is entirely unacceptable. This incident does not reflect the safe and supportive culture at our school or the behaviour of the majority of our students. Consequences for students will be considered as set out in our school's Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy. Finally a big thank you to the Portland Lion's Club who run the Laptops from Lions program. This program involves repurposing used laptop computers and then issuing them to students in need of assistance. So far, the club has donated over 90 computers to primary and secondary school students, many of them from PSC- a fantastic effort. If you have an old working laptop at home that you no longer need, bring it in to school and we can pass it on to the club – maybe there's a student out there who could really use it.

Assistant Principal of Discipline & Wellbeing

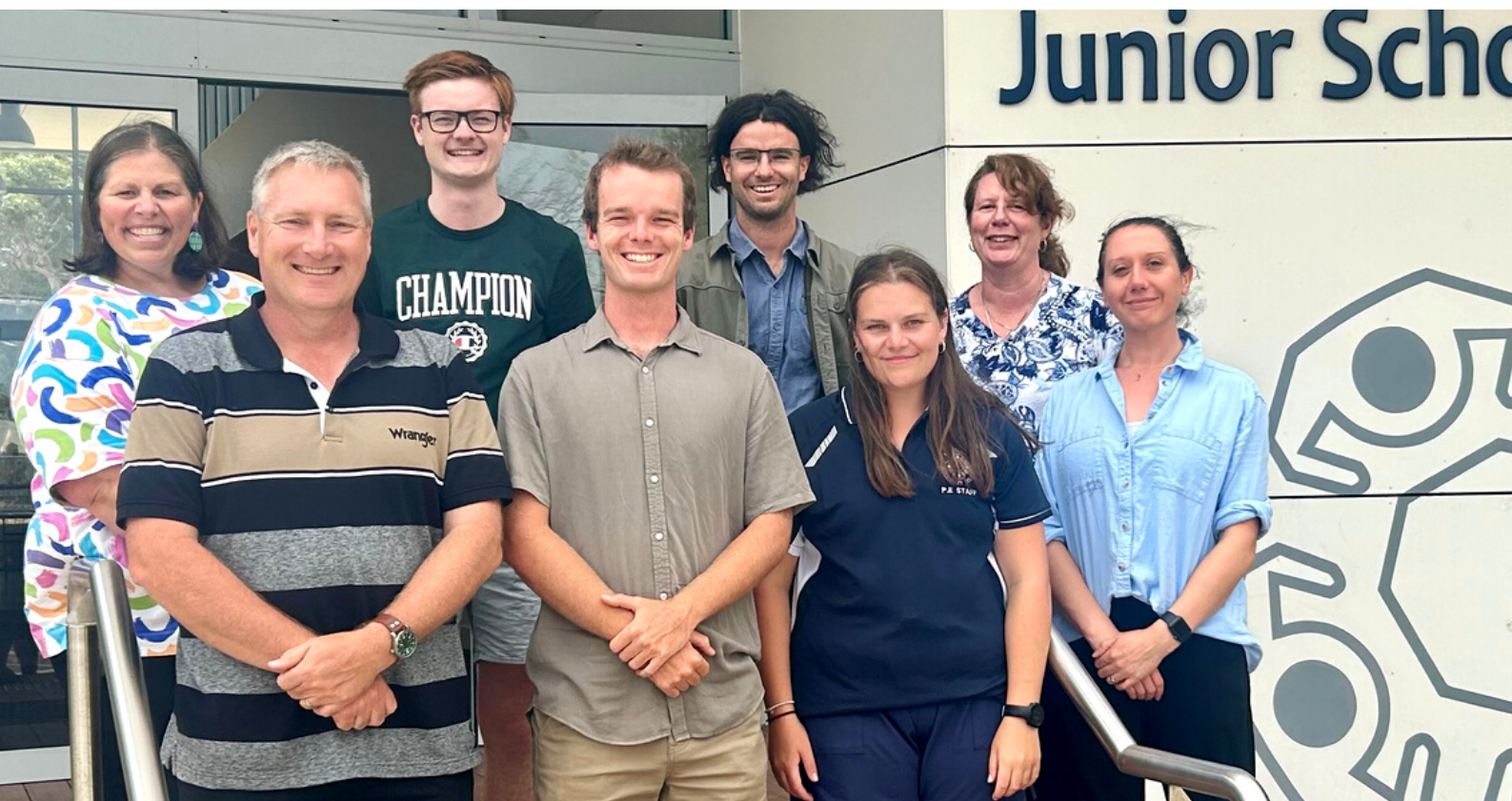
*Teaching for 10 years and at PSC for 4, Emma is primary trained and has enjoyed the challenge of secondary teaching.*

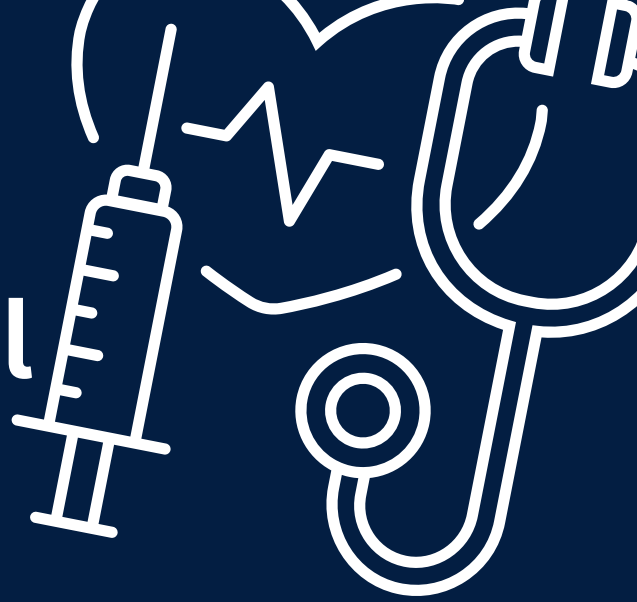
We collaborate with agencies and curriculum to promote health and wellbeing of students, staff and families.

# Compass - Attendance & Wellbeing

Attendance and wellbeing are complex, interconnected issues, but keeping track of this information shouldn't have to be difficult. Compass has made sure of that.

## Entering an Attendance Note

1 From the Compass home screen (or from your student's profile), click the **Add Attendance Note** item.

2 From the pop-up window

- ➔ Select the reason
- ➔ Enter a brief description of the absence
- ➔ Select the start and finish time
- ➔ Click the 'Save' button

Where possible, attendance notes should be entered prior to the absence/lateness occurring.



### What is an Attendance Note?

An Attendance Note is used to explain when your child is absent or late for school.

The form is titled 'Attendance Note Editor'. It includes fields for 'Person' (Eddie ALLEN), 'Reason' (Medical/Threat), and 'Details/Comment' (Feeling unwell - have a medical appointment this afternoon). There is an 'Important Notice' section with a disclaimer. At the bottom, there are 'Start' and 'Finish' time pickers set to 08/02/2021, 08:00 AM and 08/02/2021, 03:30 PM respectively. A 'Save' button is at the bottom right.

## Summary

Using Compass you can view up-to-the-minute attendance information for your child.

### Notes

This sub-tab provides a list of attendance explanations for your child. From this tab you can also add absence notes (both past and future).

### Daily Snapshot

Recent school news items and information relevant to you. This may include newsletters, details of upcoming events.

### Explain Specific Absences

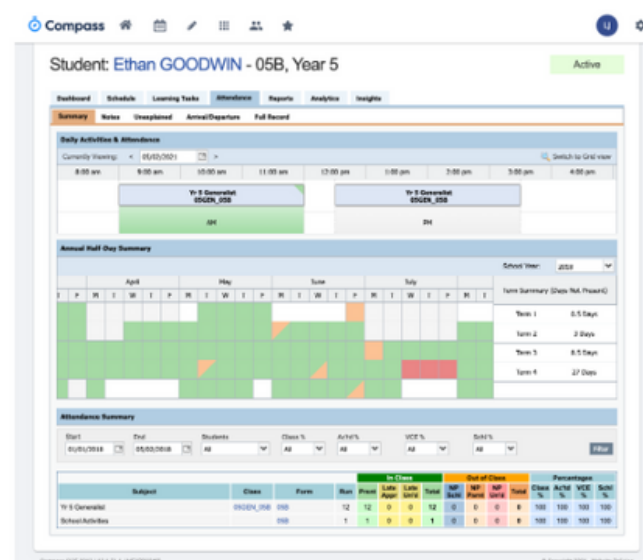
This sub-tab provides a list of all unexplained lates and absences from class. From this tab you can click to approve specific absences.

### Attendance Summary

Includes a summary of attendance in each class. For full details about a specific absence, click the appropriate number in the grid. For an explanation of a heading item, hover your mouse over the heading of interest.

When students are marked 'Not Present' in class this can sit in one of three different categories. These include:

- NP Schl** Not present in class and is explained by a school related activity.
- NP Parnt** Not present in class and is explained by a parent approval.
- NP Unap** Not present in class with no explanation entered.

The library is open for at least one break time each day so students have access and can borrow a book or magazine if they need to for Reading, which happens in classes after lunch for 10 minutes. There have been many studies that have shown the benefits of reading, so why not take along something interesting to read when you are given time?

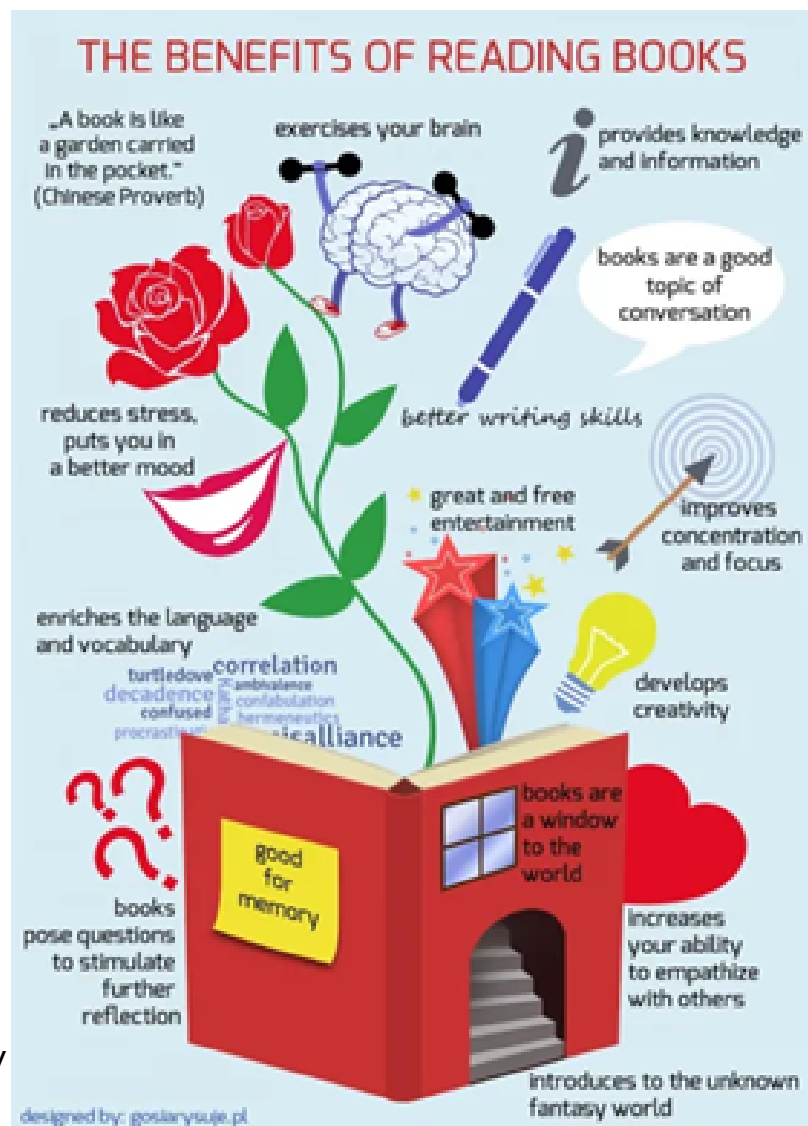
We have a wide range of books – fiction, non-fiction, graphic novels – and magazines available for borrowing, and Ms Collins is happy to have students suggest new additions to the library collection to help ensure students can find material that interests them.

Most books are available for four week loan, graphic novels and picture books have a two week loan period and magazines one week. If students want to re-borrow books, all they need to do is pop into the library, and this can be easily done.

Year 7 classes have all had an initial library familiarity session and had the opportunity to browse and borrow. It is great to see students using the library at break times to play games, read or study.

Don't forget the Library web app is also available via the star menu on Compass and has access to a range of resources, including audio and eBooks 24/7. Year 7 students will be timetabled into the library to have a second session to help familiarise them with the Library Web App in the coming weeks.

Homework Club is held in the library every Wednesday and Thursday until 4.30, with staff available to assist with homework and private study. Often tutors will also hold sessions at these times.

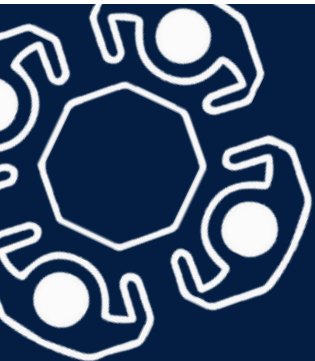

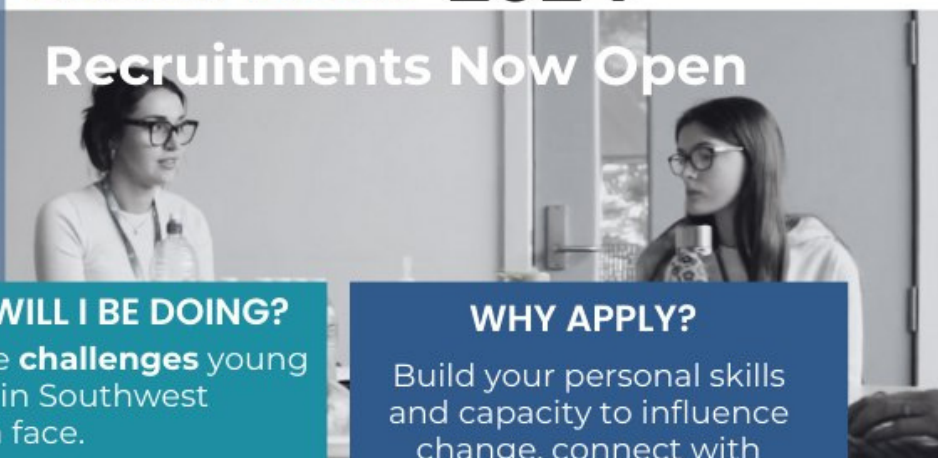
